Outstanding Oceanian Organisms

Kiwi

Small birds which are exclusively found in New Zealand. They lay the largest egg relative to their size, it is a third of the adults weight when fully formed. They are one of the only nocturnal birds in the world as well as one of the only birds which lives in a burrow.





Cassowary

This large ratite is covered in black feathers except for the vibrant, vivid flaps of skin called a wattle, it is red and blue. They are also extremely aggressive and will attack anyone trying to harm their chicks. They use their lethally long claws to slice skin with ease leaving a bloody mess.

<u>Emu</u>

Emus are the second largest bird in the world, just below the ostrich. They're also known as black birds due to their murky, dark green and partially black organs. They have a fluffy yet stiff coat of greyish brown feathers.



<u>Echidnas</u> <u>Frilled Lizard</u>

These peculiar animals are one of three egg-laying mammals (two of them are species of echidnas). They have pointy quills and toothless jaws with fifteen centimetre-long sticky tongues. They also

have the second lowest body temperature of all mammals and are named after the Greek 'Mother of Monsters'.



These scaly and seemingly harmless lizards pack a frightening punch. This is in the form of a thin layer of skin that they fan out from their head, creating an intimidating yet fascinating

and unique ability. They are often found lying on tree trunks in the shade.



Did you know?

Australia is home to the two most venomous animals in the world, the box jellyfish and the taipan snake. The box jellyfish is the most venomous creature on the planet and is also known as sea wasp or cubozoan. There are approximately 50 species and they are found in coastal marine waters. Another one of the most deadliest animals is the taipan snake and these snakes are of the genus oxyuranus in the elapid family. They are large, fast-moving and highly venomous creatures, endemic to Australia and New Guinea.








Flags of Europe throughout history by Alfred

Flags of history represent the nation itself, and can be a symbol of that nation, striking fear in their enemies. For example, Great Britain's flag features a combination of the English, Scottish and Northern Irish flags. And this flag of the **Holy Roman Empire (above)** which dominated Central Europe between the years of 800 and 1806. The eagle was believed to be used by King Charlemagne, the founder of the empire and the yellow background symbolises gold, and after the 1500s, the claws were even turned red to appear bloody and intimidating.



This flag (left) is of **France** when leader Napoleon ruled over France.

This sparked the Napoleonic Wars, as France no longer being a monarchy sparked an imbalance of power in Europe.

The fleur-de-lys are a symbol of the French monarchy and the golden eagle is for the same reasons as the previous flag, as Charlemagne also ruled over France.



This flag is not of a country, but instead a company. This is the **Dutch East India** Company, the richest company in the world with a total of £5,896,560,000,000.

Fortunately, it declared bankruptcy in the 1700s. The VOC displayed in the centre is Dutch for its very name.



This is the flag of the Second Spanish Republic. After winning the elections in 1931, Spain had turned into a republic. The coat of arms in the centre indicates a united Spain with all the ancient kingdoms. This has been incorporated in the flag since 1492! The purple is displayed on Catholic colours displayed on vestments. The red and yellow however are iconic Spanish colours that remain on the flag to this day, with the monarchy being restored.

A Hero Arises

In Mount Kumotori, a local charcoal seller called Tanjiro lived with his family until the first demon, Muzan Kibutsuji, attacked his home, killing all but one of his relatives. The sibling in question was Nezuko Kamado, who was demonised in the attack. Now fighting against her: her brother Tanjiro Kamado, the so-called mountain God Inuske Hashibira and Zenitsu Agatsuma. In her journey, she had faced many demons. The list includes: Lower 5, Lower 1, Upper 6 and Upper 4, as Upper 5 was defeated by Mist Hashira Muichiro Tokito of the once eight Hashira. Now 7, known as Flame Hashira, Kyojuro Rengoku — son of previous Hashira, Shinjuro the Rengoku. Ever since Tanjiro Kamado completed the demon slayer core test and defeated the hand demon, Teoni freed the spirits of the people he had eaten during the test who were previous students of Sakonji Urokodaki. After obtaining his Nichirin sword and setting out on his first mission, Tanjiro Kamado had achieved great things and had beaten 2 lower rank demons and 3 upper ranked demons. In turn, he became a hero in the demon slayer core . Sadly, since the demon slayer core





wasn't recognised by the government, Tanjiro's efforts were not recognised anywhere except the demon slayer core. Hopefully, this hero would be able to finally defeat the king of the demons, Muzan Kibutsuji, and find a cure for demonism.
